

Summer Reading at the Library

A mountain of research shows that children who don't read over the summer break can lose up to three months of reading proficiency.

The Redwood City Public Library comes to the rescue to help parents fight Summer Brain Drain by offering a multitude of fun incentives and family programs to keep everyone reading all summer long!

Reading/Listening Clubs!: Read for 600 minutes (10 hours) before August 31st and receive wonderful prizes. Sign up for the Listening Club and listen for 10 hours and receive the same prizes. Parents have the options of reading to their children, reading to themselves as their children read their books, or a combination of the two.

Sign-ups start **June 14th** and continue throughout the summer at all four Redwood City libraries. Prizes include a free book each child can select herself from the hundreds we'll have to choose from, a free game of mini-golf at Malibu Castle, a discount at Redwood Roller Rink, a Round Table Pizza coupon, and more!

Programs!: The Library's deliciously fun weekly summer programs for the whole family are held each Tuesday (4 pm at Schaberg, 7 pm at Downtown) and Wednesday (4 pm at Fair Oaks, 6:30 pm at Redwood Shores). Programs are FREE and for all ages.

New Library Program, Baby and Me

Since Fall 2012, 150 babies with their parents/caregivers participated in five sessions of a new class at the Downtown Library, Baby and Me, including one for teen moms. It focuses on making parents aware of the importance of reading to their babies, starting at birth, as a way to provide language enrichment and pre-literacy skills. The six week class provides an opportunity for the parents to strengthen the bond with their babies and to introduce concepts such as stories, numbers, letters, colors and shapes and build listening, memory and vocabulary skills

The hour long class includes nursery rhymes, songs, unison

reading, flannel board stories, book sharing, parenting information, the construction of handmade toys and an opportunity for socialization.

Thanks to a generous gift from the Friends, each family also received three new board books to start building a home library for their babies.

The goal of the program is to instill the love of books, reading and libraries and introduce the participants to the library's programs and services.

Additional Baby and Me at the Library classes will be offered in both English and Spanish and a new class, **Toddler and Me**, has been added.
