Summer Reading Clubs help prevent that "summer slide" in learning experienced by kids over the summer months. And children who do not read proficiently by third grade are four times more likely to drop out of high school than confident readers. The Friends of the Redwood City Public Library has always strongly supported all efforts to help kids discover the love of reading and learning – especially in the summer!

This year we are stepping up the effort to combat summer learning loss by launching a Summer Learning Program (SLP). Kids must still read but to complete the Summer Learning Program, they also must participate in various "learning experiences" geared to their age-group. Pre-readers may be asked to attend library storytime, or visit a new park; readers might be encouraged to read to a dog in the library, or make a puppet and use it to tell a story; older readers are encouraged to visit a museum, download and read an ebook, or attend a library craft program.

The Friends of the Library is supporting summer learning by funding the traditional weekly array of professional children's entertainers at all Redwood City libraries. This summer's slate includes internationally loved singer José-Luis Orozco, a great white shark Ocean Experience, and live animals from Wild Things, Inc., among other great programs.

To support the broader scope of SLP, the Friends has provided additional funding for Science Camp, featuring a variety of hands-on science activities, and a series of Jump into Writing classes, offering fun activities to keep writing, spelling and computer keyboarding skills current.
