

## What's a Summer Learning Challenge?

It's a **reading** incentive to keep families engaged with books all summer long! And it's a motivator to find new **experiences** during that out-of-school time. And it's a summer **extravaganza** with **learning** opportunities for everyone in the family.

This year the Redwood City Public Library is stepping up the fun (and learning). Kids must either read five books or listen to books every day for at least 30 days. And, to complete the challenge, each child must partake in fun learning experiences – or create some of her own. Learning experiences can be as easy as enjoying a rousing *Rhythm Rats of Kathmandu* show by Caterpillar Puppets, as interactive as exploring a local museum or as creative as recording video book reviews.

The Summer Learning Challenge includes every member of the family: Listeners, Readers, Teens and Parents! Challenge record-keeping forms are available in English, Spanish and Chinese. New this year is an online log where children and adults can keep track of their reading and learning activities while earning online badges.

The Friends of the Redwood City Public Library once again has provided the funding for a broad array of activities, including popular recording artist José-Luis Orozco, live animals from Wild Things, Inc., Karen Quest - Cowgirl Tricks, James Henry's Rhythm Talks, Owen Baker-Flynn's Act in a Box, and the antics of Daffy Dave! There will be weekly storytimes, music classes, a coding club, crafts and origami. Kids will be able to create a wallet or a phone cover in Sticky Fingers duct tape programs. Or even read to a dog at Paws for Tales. All of our summer programs count toward the summer learning challenge goal.
