Each year, the Friends looks for fun ways to reach out to the community to publicize the library, encourage reading and generate support for our group. Here are a few things we are doing this summer:

#### **July Fourth Parade**

Library staff and the Friends teamed up to march in Redwood City's July Fourth parade. Thank you to librarian Pam Schwartz, who found the thematically perfect FREADOM shirt. And thanks to all our marchers, some who wore the shirt and some who dressed up as a favorite book character. We were greeted with many shouts of "love the library" and "yay, library". Additionally, we held a 50¢ book sale in front of the library during the parade while the library staff registered Summer Learning Challenge participants.

#### Kidchella

This summer, Redwood City is sponsoring four free children's concerts on Courthouse Square. The Friends sells books during the music performance. Children enjoy the music, crafts and jump houses and they and their parents also shop for books. This

is a fun and profitable event for us and a great way to introduce our Bookstore to the community. There will be two more concerts this summer: August 13 with Alison Faith Levy's Big Time Tot Rock Band and September 10 with Andy Z and the Andyland Band.

#### **Summer Sales**

This summer, we are setting up a tent in front of the Downtown Library on Sundays from 11:30 a.m. to 3:30 p.m. to sell books for 50¢ each. We sell primarily kids' books, paperbacks, cookbooks and sometimes CDs and DVDs. By hosting a tent outside, we hope people will stop by and then check out the store inside too.

#### **Little Bookhouses**

In our last newsletter, we featured our Little Bookhouse project to put books inside local businesses. Cyclismo Cafe (871 Middlefield Road/Theatre Way) is the latest business to join. Friends volunteer Mike Turturici constructed an adorable bike-themed house (see over for a picture) for the cafe. # Summer Learning Challenge

The 2017 Summer Learning Challenge is in full swing at our libraries. Through early July, there are 14,500 registrations! That is a whole slew of kids who pledged to read and participate in learning activities this summer. Kudos go to our library staff, whose outreach and hard work have achieved this result.

The Summer Learning Challenge is the single largest program the Friends funds. For this year, we funded \$22,160 for the program. It is a crucial component in fighting the summer brain drain that results in kids losing two to three months of math and reading skills during summer vacation.

As part of the program, there are special performances each week at all four libraries, weekly prize drawings plus the wonderful array of regular weekly library programs. In addition, Dress Up Derek the Director (library director Derek Wolfgram) is back for a second summer.



This year Derek is running off with the circus! Each week, children can vote at any library branch on what item to add to his costume.

Everyone can see Derek dressed in full ringmaster attire at the **end of challenge party** to celebrate a successful summer on **Saturday**, **August 26**, from 11 a.m. to 1 p.m. in front of the Downtown Library.
